President's Insight:

THE WORLD On The Brink

Here we are—exactly where no-one with a shred of intelligence ever wanted to be—caught in trade wars. As if a record number of armed conflicts across the world weren't enough, with nearly two-thirds of the planet engulfed in war, we've now opened a new front—an economic one. History teaches us that trade wars are often just the prelude to real, armed conflicts.

The whole situation reminds me of a person in a park who keeps throwing a boomerang, only to get hit in the head every time. And yet, they persist. They don't grasp the fundamental principle: a boomerang always comes back. The same applies to geopolitics—inevitable consequences always return as a retaliatory blow.

While some still refuse to learn from history, the world is bracing for a major turning point—the possible end of the war in Ukraine. At first glance, that sounds like great news! But only if we blindfold one eye and shut the other. Are we truly ready to naively believe in the illusion of peace?

We all talk about peace, cooperation, solidarity, and respect. But does that justify complete blindness? Or, to put it bluntly—does it make us fools?

When discussing the war between Russia and Ukraine, along with the external actors pulling the strings behind the scenes, the first question we must ask is: where do we even begin? February 2022? 2014, when Russia annexed Crimea? 2013, with the events of Maidan? What about 2008, when George W. Bush proposed Ukraine and Georgia's NATO membership? Perhaps the 1995 Budapest Memorandum? Or even further back—the collapse of the Soviet Union? The Holodomor? The rise of Nazism in Europe? Or earlier still, when imperial powers began reshaping Eastern Europe's fate?

Some might say history doesn't matter. Oh, but it does—far more than we realize. If you don't understand the history of a conflict, you don't understand its essence. And if you don't understand its essence, you'll never find a path to lasting peace.

But is it possible that this war has also triggered a conflict within the United States itself? On one side are those clinging to the unipolar world order, where the U.S. acts as the global enforcer—even as this model crumbles. On the other side are those who seek to erase the legacy of their predecessors, dismantle American global hegemony, and retreat into a multipolar world.

Can this experiment benefit America and its people? Time will tell. But one thing is already clear—the world, and the U.S. along with it, cannot afford experiments. We are living in an era of extreme tensions, where a single misstep could be catastrophic. Whether we admit it or not, the world stands on the edge of something unprecedented. And though no-one dares to say it out loud, we can no longer rule out the possibility of a third world war.

So, are we finally ready to start talking?

The Photographer Who Made History

If you had to envision and liken some of his experiences, escapades and adventures as movies when you hear stories of Jadran Lazic's earlier years, depending on the day or moment he's referring to, it could well be a hilarious comedy, tear-jerking inspirational drama or international spy flick.

His stories turned the most mundane experiences into colorfully captured scenarios but they also exposed a gripping, cohesive tale of perseverance, adaptability, self-belief and focus. One who has built photography into artful exposure, he has secured himself among the 'Who's Who' of the international photographic creative industry.

From movie stars to celebrity artistes, his name is synonymous with luxury, charisma, flair, boldness and loyalty. Elizabeth Taylor, Jamie Foxx, Johnny Depp, Chuck Norris, Cher, Marlon Brando, Shannen Doherty, Grace Jones, Jodie Foster, Robert De Niro and Clint Eastwood are only some of the heavyweight celebrities who have lent to his high-end status as a sought-after photojournalist.

Lazic was born in Split, Croatia in 1952. At a very young age, photography mesmerized him and as it turns out, it was his father's hobby. During his high school years, he started working as a city desk photojournalist and later on as a photographer of national pop music, film, television and sports celebrities. While it was multi-faceted, he began experiencing 'career claustrophobia' - he felt trapped in a sense and wanted more. Betting on himself, he relocated to Paris, intent on achieving success in that uncertain gamble.

According to him, the fact that only months upon arriving to Paris he was hired by the renowned Sipa Press photo agency "can be attributed primarily to

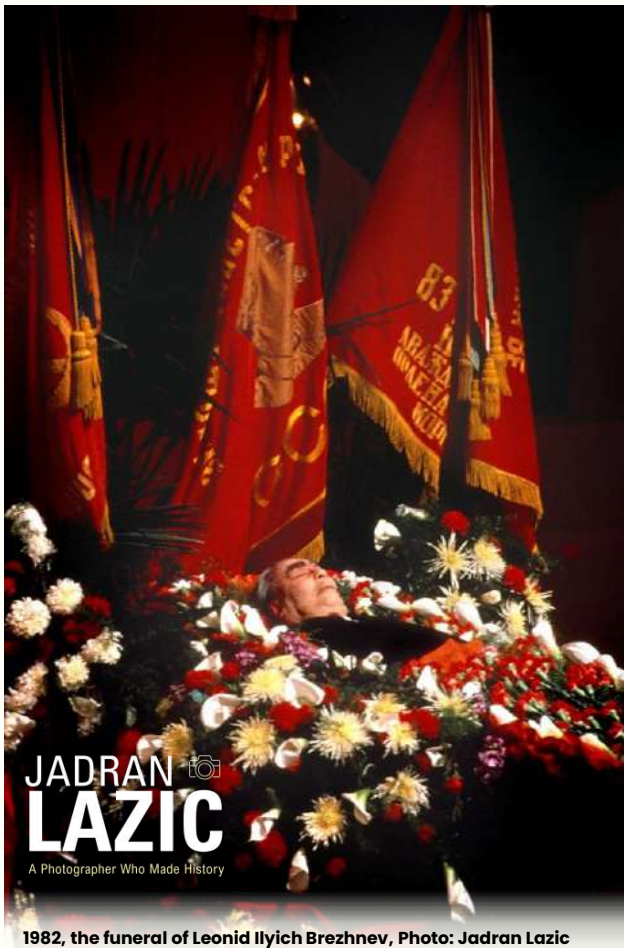
the self-confidence, creative nerve and improvisation skills typical of the people of his native Split and its competitive mentality. All the rest was talent, plus experience accumulated over time.”

What was so engaging about photography? What does he love most about being a photographer? Said Lazic, “Photography has been my passport to the world. It’s not just about capturing images; it’s about telling stories, preserving history and revealing unseen moments.

Throughout my career, I have photographed war zones, world leaders, Hollywood’s biggest icons, and everyday people with extraordinary stories. Each subject, no matter how famous or unknown, has a story to tell and I see it as my job to bring that story to life. Beyond that, photography is a universal language. Unlike words, which can be misunderstood or lost in translation, a powerful image is understood across cultures. A single photograph can capture love, loss, triumph or despair in a way that words never could.

I also love the unpredictability of photography. No two shoots are ever the same. The lighting changes, the energy shifts, and sometimes, the best moments happen unexpectedly. Whether I’m in a war zone capturing raw reality or in a Beverly Hills studio photographing a Hollywood legend, I never know exactly what I’ll get but that’s what makes it thrilling.

Ultimately, photography has given me the privilege of seeing the world from perspectives that many



never get to experience. It has allowed me to witness history, meet extraordinary people and create a body of work that will outlive me."

The respect, adoration and support that he gets now were not handed to him on a gold platter and he has not reached at this pinnacle with vague efforts. It was through hard work, street smarts, people's kindness and more. Quick-witted, resourceful, spontaneous he was in order to survive the mean starting days of his baptism into professional photography in a new country. It was truly survival of the fittest.

Upon arriving in Paris, he contacted one Stanko Mandalinić, whose phone number he had obtained in Split, and asked him for help. Mandalinić obliged and provided shelter at his factory, something for which Lazić is still immensely grateful. He stayed there for several months, however, after that, he resorted to sleeping at the homes of models and actresses whom he knew. When he could finally afford his own place, it was a small room in an attic that lacked complete bathroom facilities, only offering

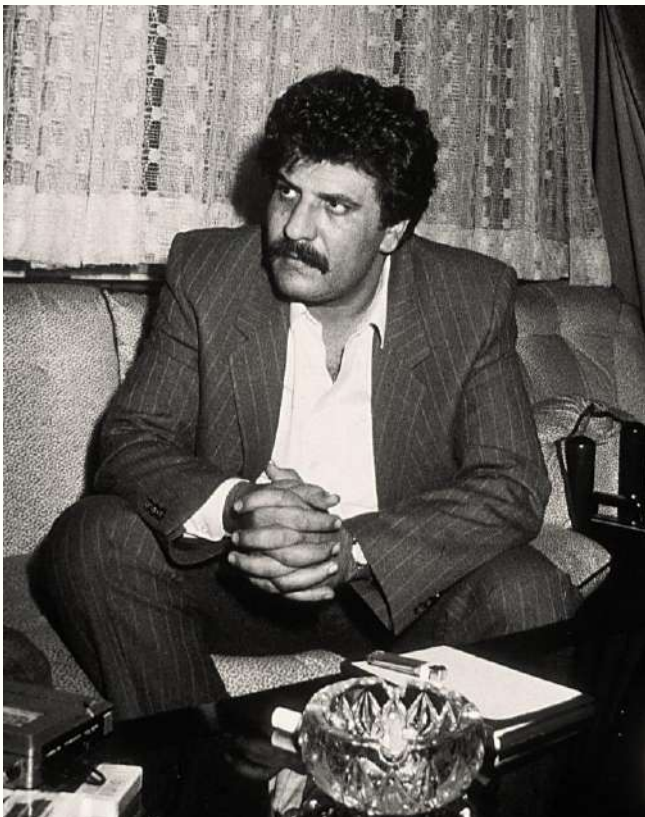

a mere sink. Unable to fulfil rent obligations, after three months, he ran away, where he had no choice but to 'sofa surf' at friends' homes.

After decades, his living legacy has already been established as he can boast of many notable career highlights. He spoke of just two instances that still fill him with boundless pride.

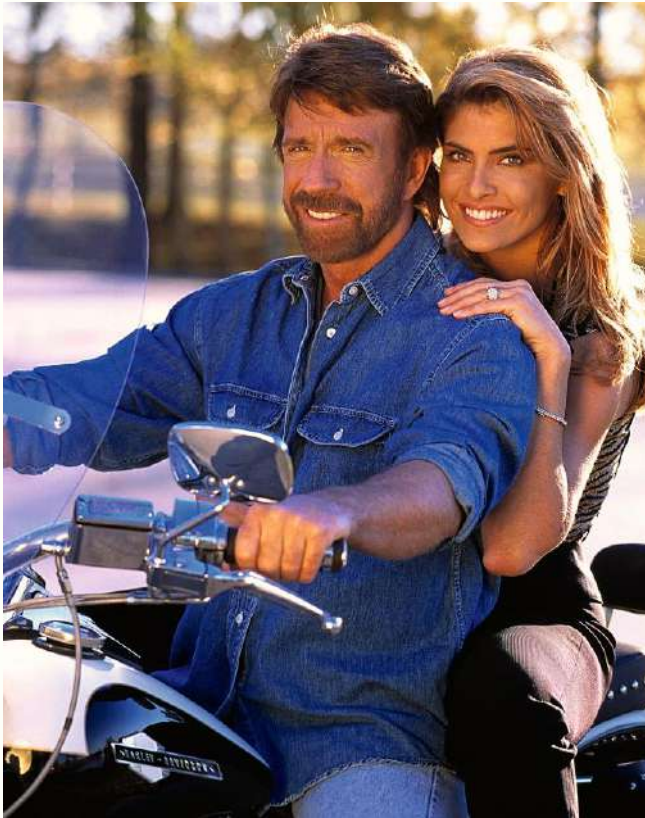
Integrity in journalism is paramount and I honored that principle despite the extraordinary circumstances.”

“For a photographer, the greatest achievement, the ultimate dream, is to capture an exclusive photo. A moment no-one else has, yet the entire world is eager to publish. I achieved this rare distinction twice.

The first was in 1982, when I managed to enter the Soviet Union – sealed behind the Iron Curtain – using my Yugoslav passport. I was the only photographer to capture exclusive images of the funeral of Leonid Ilyich Brezhnev. I was the only photographer to take exclusive pictures of Leonid Ilyich Brezhnev’s funeral. One of my photos, Body of Leonid Brezhnev, lying in state at the Pillar (Column) Hall of the House of the Unions, was named ‘Photo of the Year’ by Newsweek in 1982.

The second was in 1985 in Belgrade, when I secured the only exclusive photos of Abu Abbas – the man the Americans labeled a terrorist. At that time, the U.S. government was offering \$2.5 million for any information leading to his whereabouts. Yet, I was there with him, capturing images that no-one else had. As a journalist, I have always upheld one fundamental rule: never reveal a source or disclose the location where a photograph was taken. Integrity in journalism is paramount and I honored that principle despite the extraordinary circumstances.

Both of these world exclusives were sold in 52 countries. The Brezhnev photos alone earned \$300,000.00, while the Abu Abbas series generated

nearly \$100,000.00, with Time magazine paying an unprecedented \$50,000.00 for a single photo.

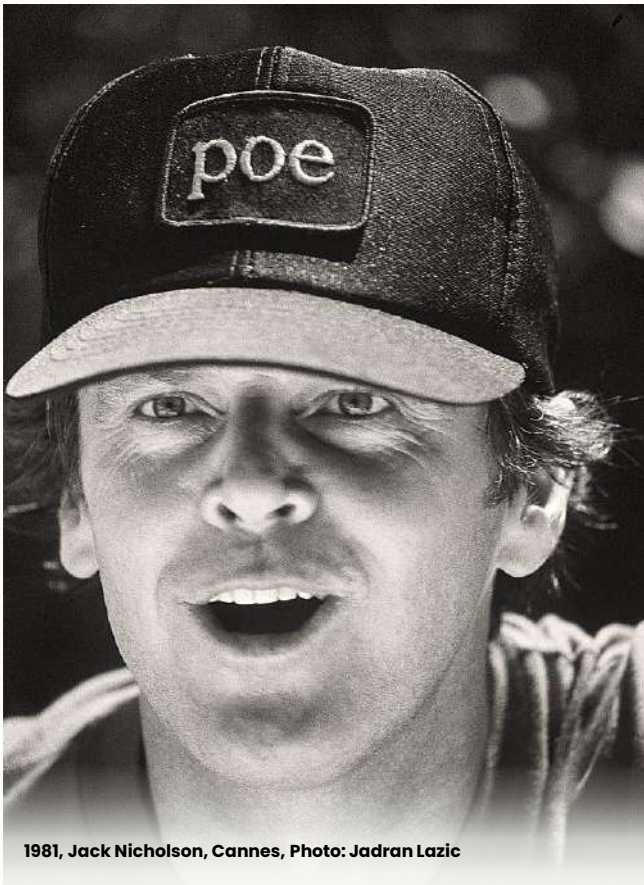
Moments like these define a photographer's legacy, proving that sometimes, the right place, the right time and the right eye can capture history in a way no-one else can.”

When he left Paris and went to Los Angeles, it was mere years before he became “one of the leading portrait photographers of the jet-setters in the global show business”. Lazic no longer had to seek clients; he was then in high demand. His photographs were printed on the covers and inner pages of the world's leading magazines - Time, Newsweek, Paris Match, Hello!, Stern, People and Gala.

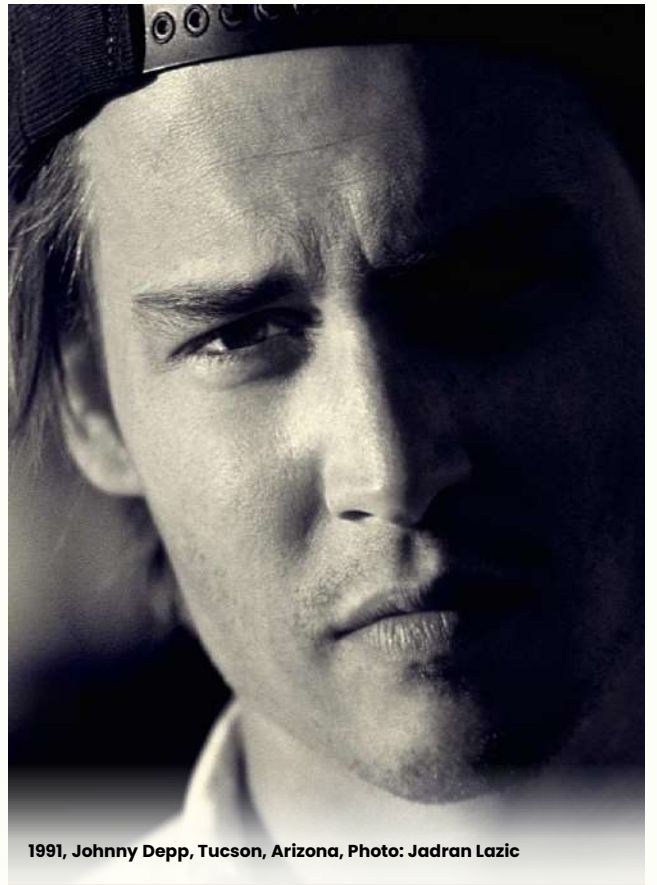
These amazing feats were a testament to many things, including his grit, and as mentioned before, reaching to this level was a fight at first. Having to get creative in order to survive taught him lifelong lessons. What are three fundamental life lessons that he learned during those challenging periods? He shared the following:

“1. Resilience is the foundation of success.

Starting out in photography, especially in a foreign country, was not easy. I had no safety net, no guaranteed income and no certainty that my efforts would pay off. There were days when I didn't know where my next meal would come from. But I refused to give up. I knocked on doors, introduced

myself to editors and took every opportunity, no matter how small. That experience taught me that setbacks and hardships are not signs to quit - they are tests of how much you really want something. I learned that success is not about talent alone but about persistence and the ability to keep moving forward even when things seem impossible.

2. Relationships matter more than money.

In my early days in Paris, I relied on the kindness of friends and strangers - people who gave me a place to sleep, shared a meal or introduced me to someone who could help my career. Those relationships became the foundation of my success. In business and in life, who you know matters as much as what you know. I never took those connections for granted. I nurtured them, and in return, I built a network of people who believed in me and helped me along the way.

3. Confidence can open doors that talent alone cannot.

I wasn't afraid to approach people - whether it was a celebrity I wanted to photograph or an editor I wanted to work with. I believed in my work and I made sure others saw that belief. I've seen

many talented people fail simply because they were afraid to put themselves out there. You have to be bold. If you don't believe in yourself, no-one else will.”

Having boldly approached countless celebrities to be prospective clients, what gave him the confidence to be so bold with his pursuits?

He shared, *“Confidence comes from two things: knowing your worth and not fearing rejection. When I started, I wasn’t a household name. I was just another photographer trying to break into the business. But I understood that celebrities need photographers just as much as we need them. They need someone who can capture their best angles, tell their story and help shape their public image. I wasn’t just offering them a photograph - I was offering them a way to be remembered.*

The other factor was persistence. If I believed I could take the best portrait of a particular celebrity, I didn’t wait for someone to introduce us. I found a way to get to them. I had a knack for being in the right place at the right time but that wasn’t luck; it was strategy. I knew where they’d be, what events they’d attend and how to approach them in a way that felt natural and not intrusive.”

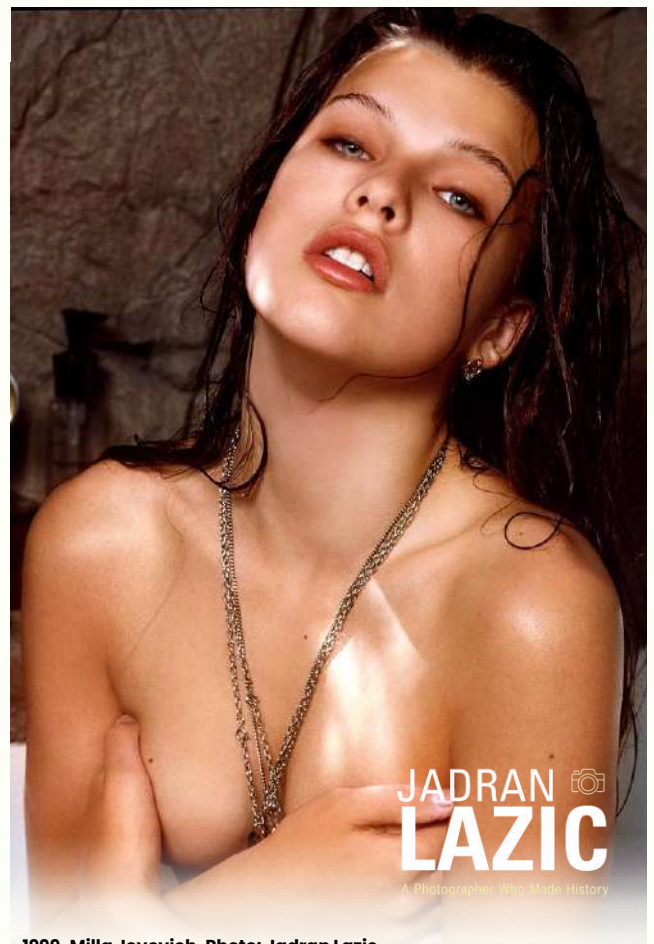
It is that same type of confidence that he saw in a young man he encountered. In a pensive moment, he realized that that young man somewhat reminded him of himself. Wanting to give him an opportunity just like others had given him in his younger years, Lazic agreed to be in front of the camera this time to be photographed. That photographer was Branimir Kralj, and it so

happens that it was Kralj who shot Lazic’s photo which was used for this Edition’s Global Trends Magazine cover.

It is no secret that part of the Hollywood hustle was and still is selling secrets and controversial images of celebrities and public figures. Lazic was very much in positions and situations in his career where he could have easily made a fortune (by that time’s standards) by selling unflattering or wholly salacious or controversial photos to media houses. However, he didn’t give in to the temptation. How important are integrity and reputation to him, personally and business-wise?

He answered, *“Integrity is everything. I built relationships with people who trusted me and that trust was worth far more than any quick cash grab. A scandalous photo might make money in the short term but it destroys credibility in the long term. I was in this business for the long run and my reputation opened far more doors than any tabloid deal ever could.”*

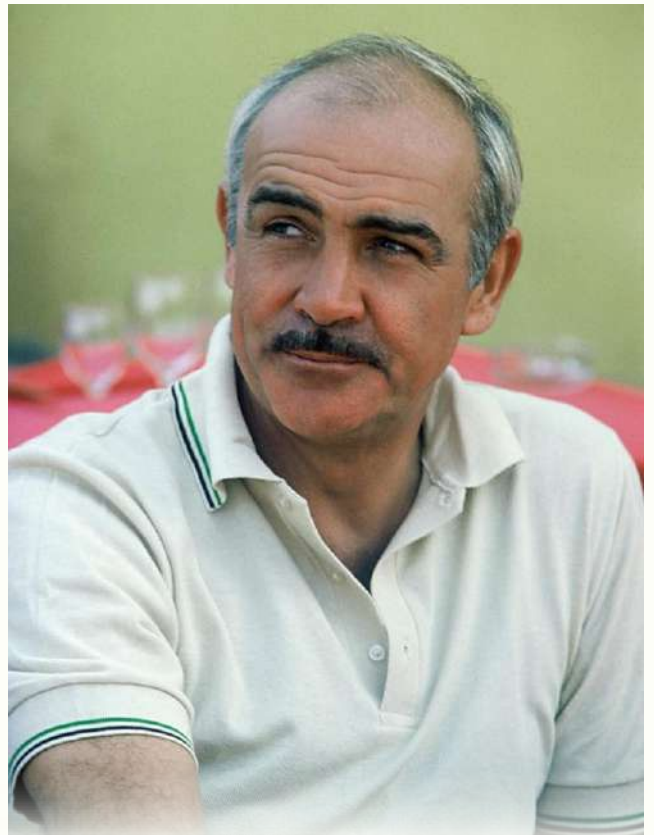
Like his reputation, he is bent on ensuring that his work speaks volumes and reaches the masses.

This idea spawned a book filled with his photos. What inspired him to do the book?

Explained Lazic, "My book is a way to capture my life's work and leave a lasting legacy. After five decades of photographing some of the most famous people and pivotal moments, I realized that my collection wasn't just a portfolio; it was a time capsule. The inspiration came from two things:

1. The desire to tell the stories behind the images. Every photo I've taken has a backstory - sometimes exciting, sometimes dangerous and sometimes deeply personal. I wanted to share those moments in a way that went beyond just the photographs themselves.

2. A need to preserve the legacy of true photography. We live in an era of disposable images. Billions of photos are uploaded every day but very few are timeless. My book is a reminder of a time when access, trust and artistry were required to get the perfect shot.

I hope the book will serve as both an inspiration and a reminder that the right image took more than just pressing a button on a phone. It's not just a personal project; it's something that I hope my

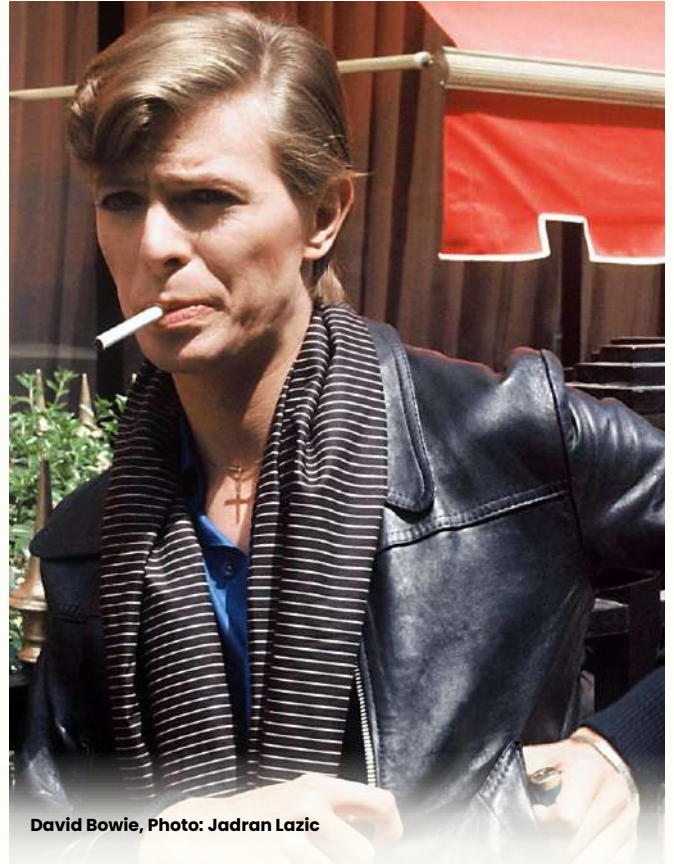
family can look back on with pride.”

Speaking of 'just pressing a button on a phone', what has it been like for him observing the shift from exclusive photojournalism to self-promotion via social media?

He shared his point of view saying, "It's been fascinating. When I started, getting a photo published in Time, Newsweek or Paris Match was a

major achievement. Those publications dictated what the world saw. Now, celebrities and influencers control their own narrative through Instagram, TikTok and YouTube.

While this shift gives public figures more control, it also means that the art of photojournalism has changed. It's no longer just about capturing a rare moment - it's about creating images that stand out in a sea of endless content. A great photo still matters but now it has to compete with thousands of selfies and staged moments uploaded every second."

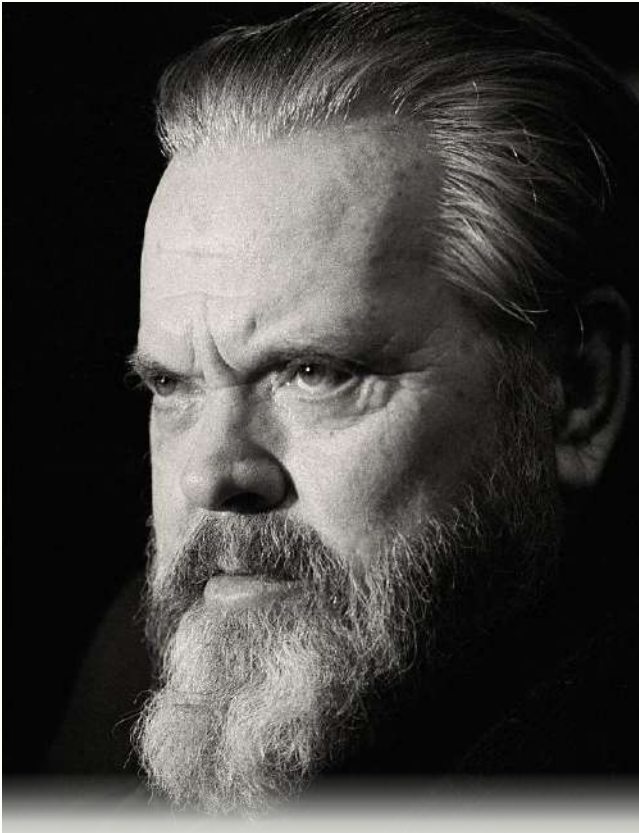
Fearmongers constantly chant that artificial intelligence (AI) will render many jobs obsolete. There is also the growing practice of AI replacing traditional photography for ad campaigns such as with AI-generated individuals. Companies and agencies claim that this offers massive savings on time, money and resources - logistics, venue rentals, glam squad fees, schedule clashes, talent sourcing, etc. Is Lazic concerned that AI could negatively impact his life as a photographer?

"AI is an incredible tool but it can never replace the human element of photography. While AI-generated models and spokespersons may offer convenience and cost savings, they lack

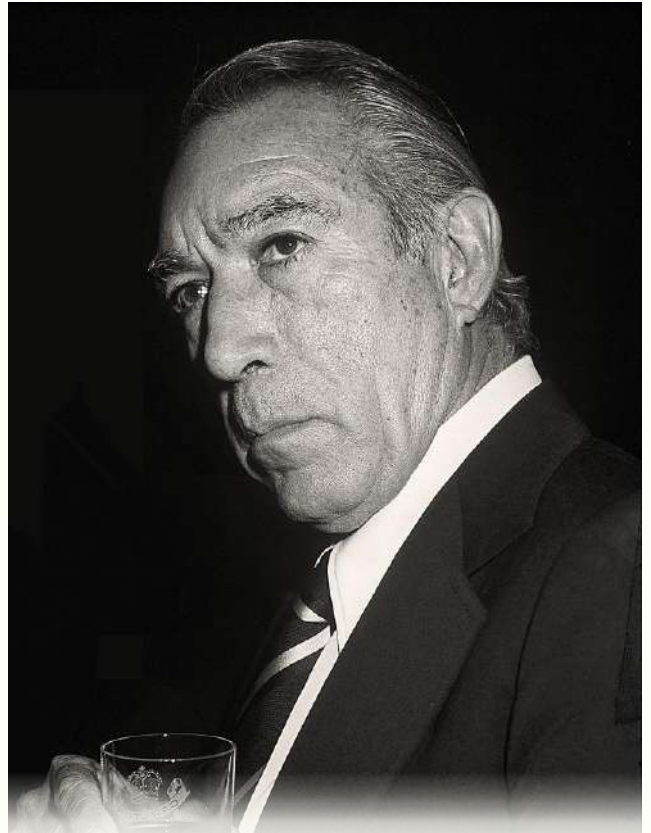

authenticity. Great photography isn't just about aesthetics - it's about emotion, connection and storytelling. AI can create a perfect-looking image but it cannot capture the real essence of a person, the depth in their eyes or the emotion in a candid moment.

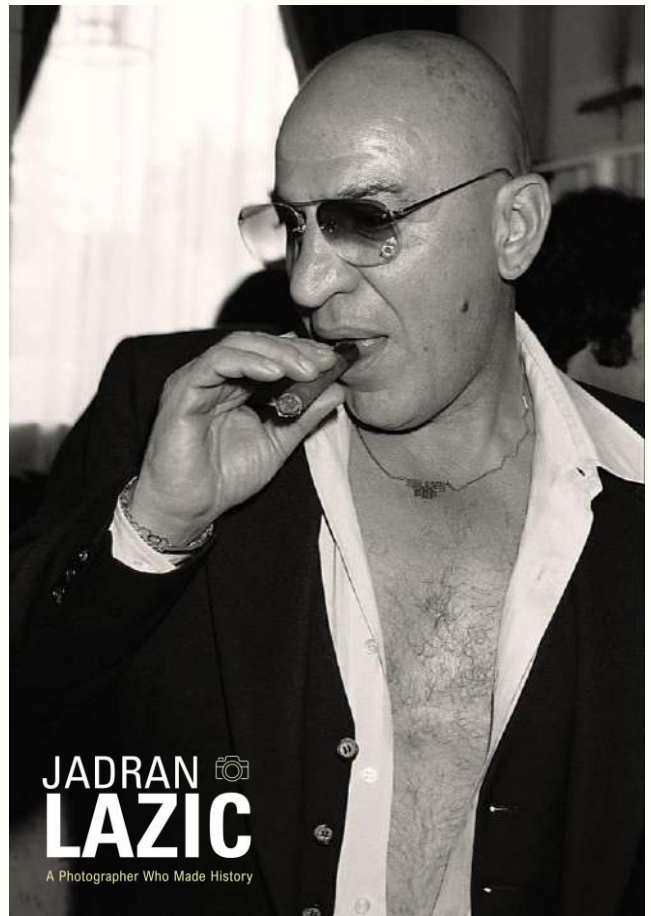

That being said, I believe that photographers must adapt. AI will continue to evolve and those who embrace it as a tool rather than a threat will thrive. The key is to find ways to integrate new technology while preserving the artistry of photography."

He doesn't see traditional photography being a dying craft. "Photography will evolve but it won't die. Technology changes but the need for storytelling remains. The world will always need photographers who can capture history, emotion and humanity in ways that a smartphone or AI program can't replicate."

One traditional edge he has maintained is exhibitions to showcase his work. He spoke of the most recent one. "My most recent exhibition was held in Varaždin, Central European Baroque town and ancient Croatian capital, and it was open to both the general public and industry insiders.

The exhibition showcased some of my most iconic images - portraits of Hollywood legends, rare behind-the-scenes moments and powerful documentary photography from my time covering world events. The goal was to take visitors on a journey through time, showing them how photography has captured history, shaped culture and influenced storytelling.

One of the most rewarding aspects of the exhibition was seeing how people reacted to the images. Some were drawn to the glamour of Hollywood, while others were deeply moved by the rawness of war photography. That's the beauty of photography. It speaks to people in different ways.

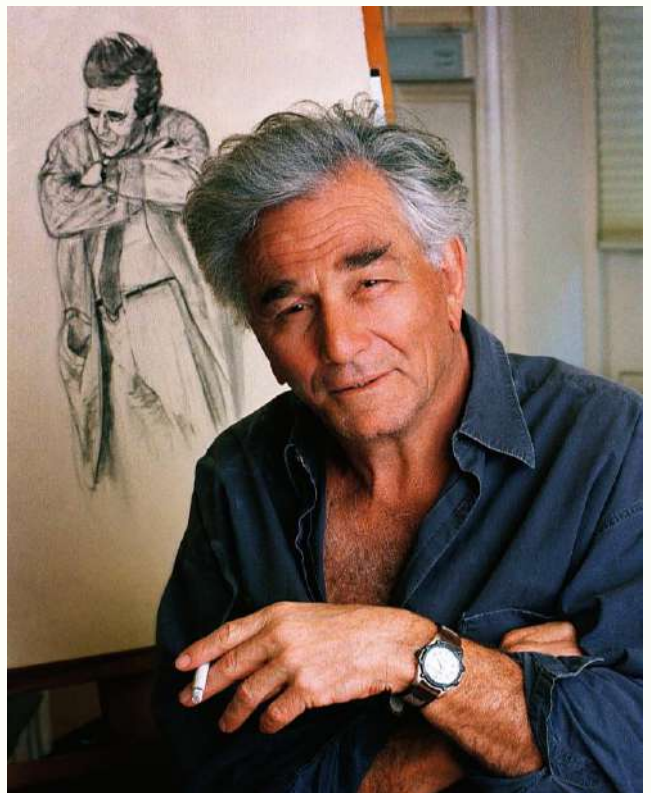
The exhibition also included a special section on the evolution of photography, comparing old-school film techniques with modern digital methods. It sparked great conversations about where the industry is headed and what the future of photography looks like. It was a rewarding experience to have my family there as well, supporting me as always. Having them by my side makes such moments even more meaningful."

Two episodes in his life series nudged him into deeper gratitude. The most recent was Los Angeles' devastating period with wildfires, which brought about unimaginable sorrow and widespread loss of residential and commercial properties. Being based there at the time, what was it like for him having a 'front row seat', so to speak, to it playing out in real time?

He first summed it up in one word. "Heartbreaking." Continuing, he said, "As a photographer, I have covered many tragedies but seeing

wildfires destroy lives and communities in real time was a different kind of devastation. There's something surreal about watching fire consume everything in its path. One minute, a home is standing, filled with memories, and the next, it's reduced to ashes. The scale of destruction is unimaginable until you witness it firsthand. Families lost everything - photographs, heirlooms, places where generations had lived.

What struck me most was the resilience of the people. Despite the loss, there was an incredible sense of unity. Strangers helped each other, volunteers risked their safety and communities came together to rebuild. Watching this disaster unfold, I couldn't help but think of my family and the safety of my loved ones. It reinforced how precious every moment is and how important it is to protect and cherish what we have."

The second experience that made him have a greater appreciation for life and his ambitions was when he had to enter the Army after he'd already begun life as a photographer. What was that experience like?

"Serving in the Army was a drastic shift from my life as a photographer but it was one of the most formative experiences of my life. The most

challenging part was the loss of personal freedom. In photography, I was used to making my own decisions, following my instincts and being in creative control. The Army was the opposite. Everything was structured and I had to follow orders without question. However, that discipline taught me resilience and adaptability. It showed me that I was capable of pushing myself beyond my limits, both physically and mentally.

Another lesson was perspective. Seeing the sacrifices that soldiers make every day gave me a deeper appreciation for life and for the freedom that I enjoyed as a photographer. When I returned to photography, I approached it with a new mindset. I had seen the world through a different lens - one that made me appreciate not only the glamorous side of my job but also the responsibility that comes with capturing history."

When he thinks about the amazing opportunities he's had and the life he's created, what thoughts are foremost in his mind?

"Gratitude. I came from a small town, with nothing but a camera and a dream, and somehow, I ended up photographing the world's most influential people. It's been a wild, unpredictable and beautiful journey.

I also think about the power of taking risks. Every major turning point in my life happened because I was willing to step outside of my comfort zone - whether it was moving to Paris, approaching Hollywood celebrities or covering dangerous war zones. Had I played it safe, my life would have been completely different. They document moments that future generations will look back on. But more than that, I'm grateful for the family I have now who remind me of what really matters. They are the heart of everything I do."

Lazic has always been inclined to 'give back', sharing his expertise and knowledge with younger generations. Told that the Global Chamber of Business Leaders (GCBL) - the founding entity of the Global Trends Magazine - has an arm called the Youth Business Leaders Program (YBLP), he was asked about his choice of mentorship. If he had the opportunity to partner with the YBLP to do a Master Class, what subject would be a top priority for him to teach and why?

"If I were to do a Master Class, I would focus on the art of resilience and personal branding in the creative industry. My Master Class would cover:

1. How to build a lasting reputation: Integrity and trust are the foundation of any long-term career.

MISTLETOE: Healing Plant Of Cancer Therapy

In a previous Edition, we described mistletoe (Isorel) as an example of a complementary remedy in integrative oncology. But what exactly is so particular about the mistletoe and its effect on individuals with Cancer?

Since When Has Mistletoe Been Used In Oncology?

Traditional natural medicine uses mistletoe as a tea to treat heavy menstrual bleeding and as a blood pressure-lowering agent. Mistletoe has been included in the homeopathic pharmacopeia since 1850. Starting in 1917, mistletoe was introduced as an injectable Cancer remedy by Dr. Ita Wegman, a gynecologist practicing in Zurich. It was the guidance of Rudolf Steiner, who identified the connection between mistletoe and Cancer with his empirical spiritual science, that led her to the use of this medicine.

The Botany And Biology Of Mistletoe

“Nothing about this plant is normal” – this is how renowned botanist Carl von Tubeuf summarized his encounter with mistletoe. Unlike typical plants that root in soil, mistletoe anchors itself to a host tree through an extraordinary evergreen structure known as a sinker, thereby connecting with the tree's flow of minerals and fluids. Especially in Spring, before the tree lets out its leaves, mistletoe absorbs a great deal from its host tree. As it is evergreen, mistletoe clearly conducts its own photosynthesis. This distinguishes it as semi-parasitic as the tree also benefits from its presence.

What is of the most striking significance, however, is the mistletoe's freedom from the normal cycle of plant development throughout the year. Almost all of its developmental rhythms run counter to those of other plants. For example, mistletoe blooms and fruits in Winter, and its most vigorous growth occurs when the vegetative growth of other plants is dormant or invisible.

It grows at a remarkably slow rate, while in its structural development, remaining simple and primitive, even youthful. Each year, this plant develops a stem, a pair of leaves and three buds for the following growth cycle and flowering. The first flowers appear after five to seven years in the Winter, accompanied by white berries. These berries also have a unique feature. Without a dense outer shell, the embryo inside remains constantly exposed to light. If this relationship to light is lost, the seedling loses its vitality and dies. The seeds of most other plants are completely different, often spending months hidden within a thick, opaque shell in the soil.

Integrative Medicine:

The berries are spread by the mistle thrush and the blackcap in Spring and Summer. This makes mistletoe dependent not only on trees but also on animals. Mistletoe is also a dioecious plant, with male pollen being transferred by insects to the female mistletoe in the Spring.

All Plants Expand Between Heaven And Earth

Almost all plant development unfolds spatially from earth towards heaven but mistletoe only does so in its initial growth cycles. From the third to fifth year onward, it develops instead, a unique, round shape. The sinker in the branch then becomes a center, out of which grows a sphere. Every detail expresses the special formative powers at work within the plant.

We find here "the profile of an eccentric". Mistletoe does not grow on the earth nor does it orient itself to the centers of the earth or sun. It remains always in a primitive form, while independent from seasonal rhythms, blooming and bearing its fruit in Winter. It accelerates or delays developmental stages and the embryo in the berry must remain continually exposed to light. All these phenomena paint the picture of an extraordinary plant character. Even the ordinary person may receive an impression of the unique substances and forces contained in the mistletoe, that may then support the patient through the Cancer illness.

Pharmacological Effects

Numerous preclinical and clinical studies have demonstrated a wide range of effects. Components of mistletoe selectively inhibit and destroy tumor cell growth (cytotoxic, cytolytic effects). The natural cell death process, which seems to be disrupted in malignant tumor cells, can be restored through mistletoe lectins - a special substance found in mistletoe.

When used during chemotherapy, mistletoe exhibits protective effects on the DNA of specific white blood cells that are crucial for defense against tumors. It is well documented that both specific and nonspecific immune systems are stimulated by it. Mistletoe also possesses significant antioxidant capacity.

The Effects Of Mistletoe On Individuals With Cancer

Both in diagnosing and evaluating the efficacy of therapies, integrative oncology focuses on the whole person. In practice, it proves useful to look through four levels of understanding.

Level One:

Material Findings

This level encompasses measurable facts and observable phenomena such as body weight, blood counts, X-rays, MRI scans, microbiological diagnostics, genetic tests and more. Conventional medicine has made very impressive advances in this area, using various study designs to define and evaluate even complex phenomena.

On this level, mistletoe demonstrates changes in blood counts, revealing its immune-stimulating and immunomodulatory properties. Its strong efficacy can also be observed in improved quality of life and relief from tumor fatigue. These effects are scientifically well-documented and evident at all stages of Cancer, especially when combined with chemotherapy to reduce side effects.

Recent data suggests a potential for prolonged survival when mistletoe is combined with standard therapies, including modern biologics. All evidence indicates there are no negative interactions with standard therapies. In fact, there may even be synergies with conventional treatments. Safety data describes mistletoe therapy as very safe with minimal side effects.

Level Two:

Vitality And Well-Being

The second level pertains to the patient's sense of

vitality and well-being, which are crucial to health and recovery. This includes the subjective experience of physical strength, endurance, resilience in social interactions and cognitive abilities like memory and concentration. Cancer and conventional treatments place significant strain on this vitality, with tumor fatigue being particularly burdensome.

Mistletoe profoundly stimulates powers of life. This leads to increased overall vitality, physical strength, emotional fortitude, a greater appetite (often accompanied by weight gain), reduced fatigue, improvements in sleep patterns, as well as depth and a healthy warming of the body. It is common for Cancer patients to report feeling physically cold as a result of the tumor or conventional therapies. Mistletoe therapy raises core body temperature and restores the circadian rhythm of body temperature, significantly improving well-being. These effects can often be felt shortly after beginning mistletoe therapy.

Level Three:

Emotional And Psychological Experience

The third level concerns the patient's emotional and psychological state - moods and feelings. Patients are burdened by more or less conscious fears, often existential in nature. Resignation, depression, helplessness and guilt are the psychological realities accompanying Cancer.

Mistletoe has a mild antidepressant effect. It is capable of restoring courage and fortitude, empowering patients to look ahead. It fosters inner emotional resilience to confront the disease, to not give up and to continue fighting. At higher doses, mistletoe has a pain-relieving effect, which can effectively support palliative care.

Level Four:

The Sense Of Self And Autonomy

The fourth level relates to the experience and activity of the self, the 'I' - the very center of the individuality that only the person can transform. No external influence can reach this sacred sanctum, although it may be supported from outside. Mistletoe serves as a valuable companion in this regard, leading patients to rediscover the path and missing melody of their life.

This therapy can enhance autonomy and self-determination. It opens new perspectives and allows patients to explore existential questions, including the meaning of their illness. Vaclav Havel, the former President of the Czech Republic who suffered from Cancer, once said: "Hope is not the conviction that something will turn out well but the certainty that something makes sense, no matter how it turns out."

Conclusion

Integrative oncology benefits greatly from tools like mistletoe therapy. While mistletoe is not a 'miracle cure' - nor does it claim to be - it is a powerful and significant companion throughout the Cancer journey.

Every Cancer patient could benefit from mistletoe therapy, which provides invaluable support in a disease that fundamentally threatens physical, emotional and spiritual well-being like no other.

WOMEN AND THE ROAD After Prison

Post-incarceration periods, as challenging as they might be, do have stories of strength and perseverance.

Reentering society after incarceration is an uphill battle for anyone but for women, the challenges are often more complex. Housing insecurity, employment barriers, family reunification, mental health struggles and social stigma all contribute to the difficulty of reintegration (Prison Policy Initiative, 2021). Women face additional hardships related to past trauma, caregiving responsibilities and systemic discrimination. Despite these challenges, many formerly incarcerated women overcome adversity and build successful lives.

Two such women, Sara Citroni and Ameena DeRamos, have demonstrated remarkable resilience in their reentry journeys. Their stories highlight both the barriers women face and the possibilities for success when provided with the right support.

Sara Citroni: Overcoming The Weight Of The Past

Sara Citroni spent 30 years in prison after a series of life-altering decisions led her down a dark path. As a teenager, she was a strong student and athlete. However, when she was 17, the death of her mother from Cancer sent her into a spiral of grief. She began spending time with a different crowd and got involved in a dangerous situation with an older man. Believing she was helping him, she lied about the circumstances of a crime, not grasping the consequences.

Sara accepted a plea deal that sentenced her to two juvenile life sentences. Shortly after, the State changed its laws, redefining life sentences as permanent. Despite these setbacks, she remained determined to improve herself. Access to online college courses allowed her to pursue higher education while incarcerated. She became deeply involved in the Second Chancers program, where she connected with mentors and she participated in the PREPARE for Parole and Reentry program.

Prison was not an easy place for Sara. She experienced firsthand the mistreatment of incarcerated women, including inadequate health and hygiene resources, exploitative wages for prison labor and the constant threat of intimidation. Nevertheless, she persevered. When a juvenile restoration Bill passed, giving individuals sentenced as minors a chance at parole hearings, even the original Prosecutor in her case advocated for her release.

Upon release, she was required to live in transitional housing, which she initially resisted but later found invaluable. After 30 years, even

basic activities like using a cellphone or driving were foreign to her. She recalled how, during her first few days in transitional housing, she only took an orange from the kitchen because it was the only item she had been allowed to keep in her cell.

Today, Sara is dedicated to helping other women navigate reentry. She works for the PREPARE organization, providing post-release support to formerly incarcerated women.

Ameena DeRamous: Advocating For Change

Ameena DeRamous, a U.S. Army veteran, was incarcerated at the age of 40. While she considers herself fortunate to have gone to prison as a mature adult, her experience was still marked by abuse, intimidation and discrimination, particularly because of her Muslim faith. She described the prison environment as highly oppressive, with guards treating their authority with near-militant control.

Unlike many inmates, Ameena was not willing to stay silent about injustices. If she witnessed mistreatment, she documented it and filed reports, advocating for herself and others. Her dedication to holding prison staff accountable made her a target for subtle and overt retaliation. One of the most egregious examples of this came on the day of her release.

Despite State regulations allowing her to wear her hijab for an identification photo, the correctional officers refused to take her picture unless she removed it. She had worn her hijab every day for 14 years, yet they attempted to strip her of her religious freedom at the final moment of her incarceration.

Fortunately, Ameena's veteran status allowed her to participate in the Maryland Center for Veteran Education and Training (MCVET) program. MCVET provided her with wraparound services, including housing and workforce training, helping her transition into society more smoothly than many others.

Ameena now works as a Workforce Development Coordinator for AMVETS, where she helps other veterans rebuild their lives. Her passion for justice has not wavered; she actively supports efforts to incorporate restorative justice into communities.

In addition, she has launched a mentorship program for young women whose mothers are incarcerated, helping them find stability and support in the absence of their primary caregivers. Her long-term goal is to establish a nonprofit that offers inclusive reentry services for all women, modeled after the comprehensive support she received through MCVET.

The Road To A More Just System

Sara and Ameena's stories illustrate both the struggles and triumphs of women reentering society. They highlight systemic issues such as employment discrimination, lack of housing and the emotional toll of adjusting to freedom. Their success demonstrates the power of education, mentorship and community support in breaking the cycle of recidivism.

Programs like PREPARE and MCVET are essential to ensuring that women leaving prison have the resources to rebuild their lives. Policy reforms must eliminate barriers to employment, education and housing while holding institutions accountable for mistreating incarcerated women.

Reentry should not be a punishment, in and of itself. It should be an opportunity for redemption and contribution to society. Women like Sara and Ameena prove that, with the right support, formerly incarcerated women can reintegrate successfully and become powerful advocates for change.

Presidential Column:

A MIGRATION Policy

All States, exercising their sovereignty, have the right to accept or reject individuals from other countries within their territory. This right is not up for debate. However, history and tradition also teach us that many nations were grown thanks to the arrival of people from diverse regions who became part of the territory that constitutes a country.

A clear example of this is the United States of America. Following its independence and throughout its history, it has welcomed millions of people from all around the world, fostering its growth and contributing to the wealth it proudly showcases. This integration and blending of cultures have resulted in a nation often seen as the ideal space for pursuing opportunities, achieving economic prosperity, realizing dreams and building families that become part of the American identity.

With this in mind, it is worth reflecting that, in recent decades, a fundamental component of the United States has been the influx of Latin Americans, who are undeniably part of the broader definition of the Americas. This geographical and cultural connection has facilitated both migration and integration.

The crises in our countries, some of them deep and ongoing, have made emigration a daily reality for many, as they seek in the United States, the opportunities that their nations may not have provided. Latinos pay taxes, buy homes and vehicles, attend universities, are outstanding as professionals in various fields and help mitigate the effects of an aging population, given that the Latino demographic in the U.S. is predominantly young.

For these reasons, we must question the actions of the current U.S. administration, which is deporting migrants to their countries of origin without considering the economic turmoil this could create within its borders. These measures also strain relations with other countries and continents.

A genuine reflection on these issues is necessary. Those who take the time to analyze them, may find themselves surprised by the significant contributions that Latin American migrants make to the United States.

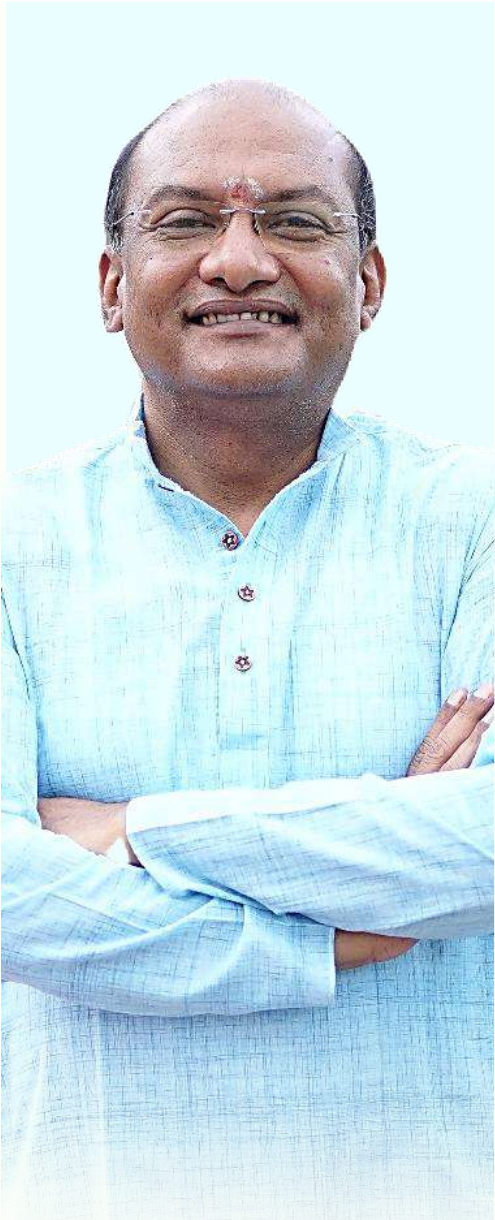

VOLVO OWNERS SHOCKED

By Fake Bowers & Wilkins Speakers!

When you purchase a premium vehicle, you expect premium quality—especially when you're paying top dollar for the best technology and craftsmanship. But for some Volvo owners in China, that expectation has turned into a shocking revelation: their luxury cars may be hiding counterfeit components.

The controversy erupted after an unsuspecting owner of a Volvo S60 took to social media, complaining that the supposedly high-end Bowers & Wilkins sound system in his car didn't quite sound right. Upon opening up the speaker housing, he made a disturbing discovery—the speakers were not genuine. Even worse, the brand name was misspelled as "Bowers & VVlikins." The questionable speakers were part of a promotional package offered by an official Volvo dealer in China.

What started as a single complaint quickly turned into a wave of outrage. Volvo has long touted its collaboration with Swedish glassmaker Orrefors to create an elegant, illuminated gear shifter—but affected

With the scandal growing, Volvo was forced to issue an official statement:

"Volvo Cars takes customer complaints very seriously. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience or distress caused by this issue. Volvo Cars stands firmly by its customers and will not tolerate any conduct that undermines their interests. We have launched an immediate investigation and are committed to full transparency in identifying the cause and taking appropriate actions."

However, critical questions remain unanswered: How widespread is this problem? Are certain dealers knowingly supplying counterfeit parts?

trust in an industry where premium pricing should guarantee premium authenticity.

For now, the investigation is ongoing. But one thing is clear—Volvo must act fast if it hopes to salvage its reputation in the world's largest automotive market.

The Arctic Turns Into A **CARBON SOURCE**

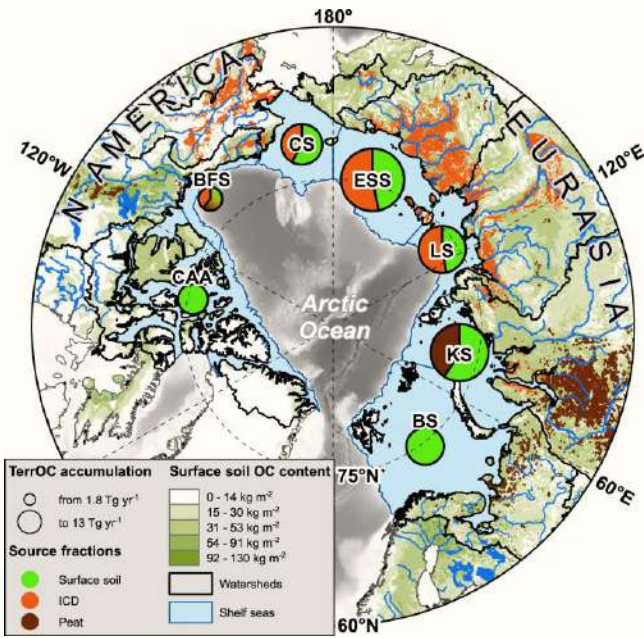

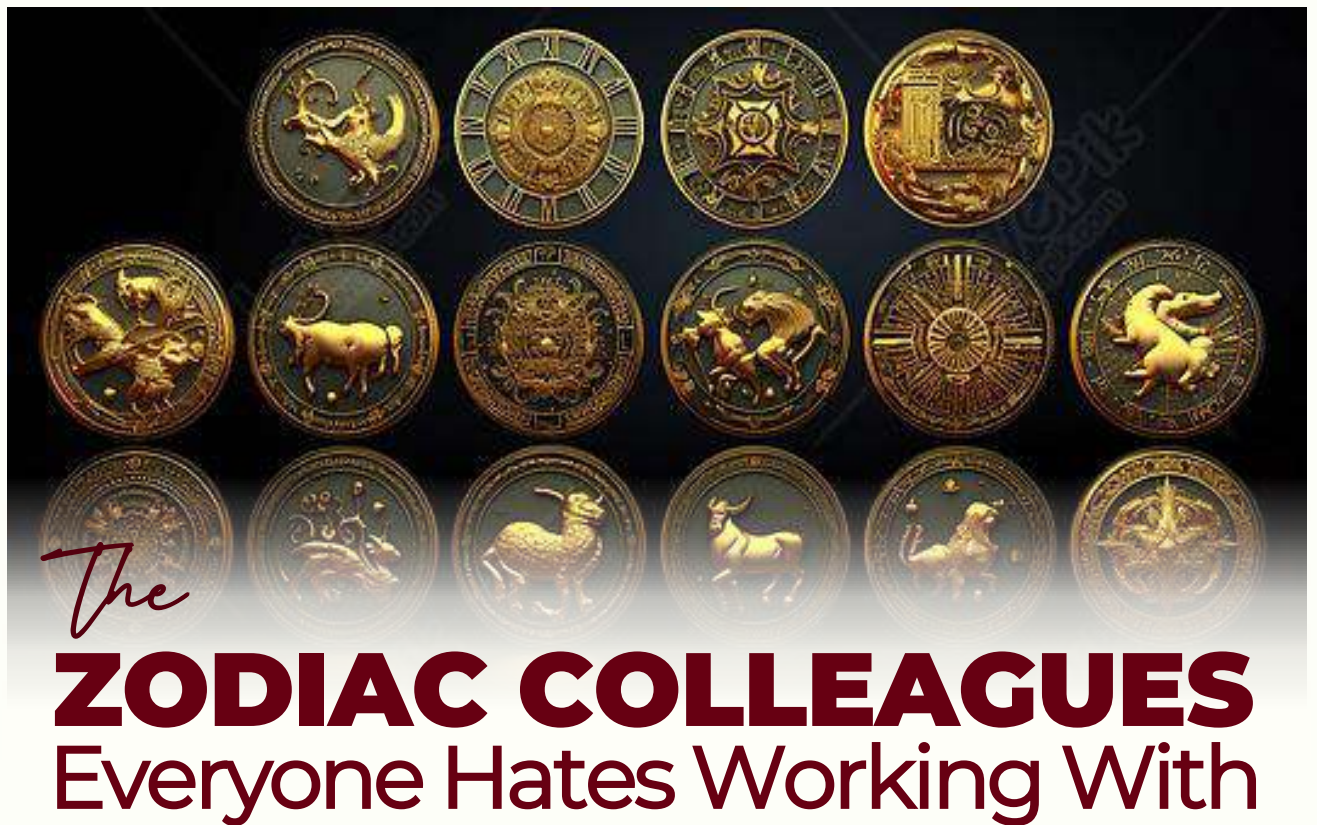

The Workaholic Perfectionist from Hell

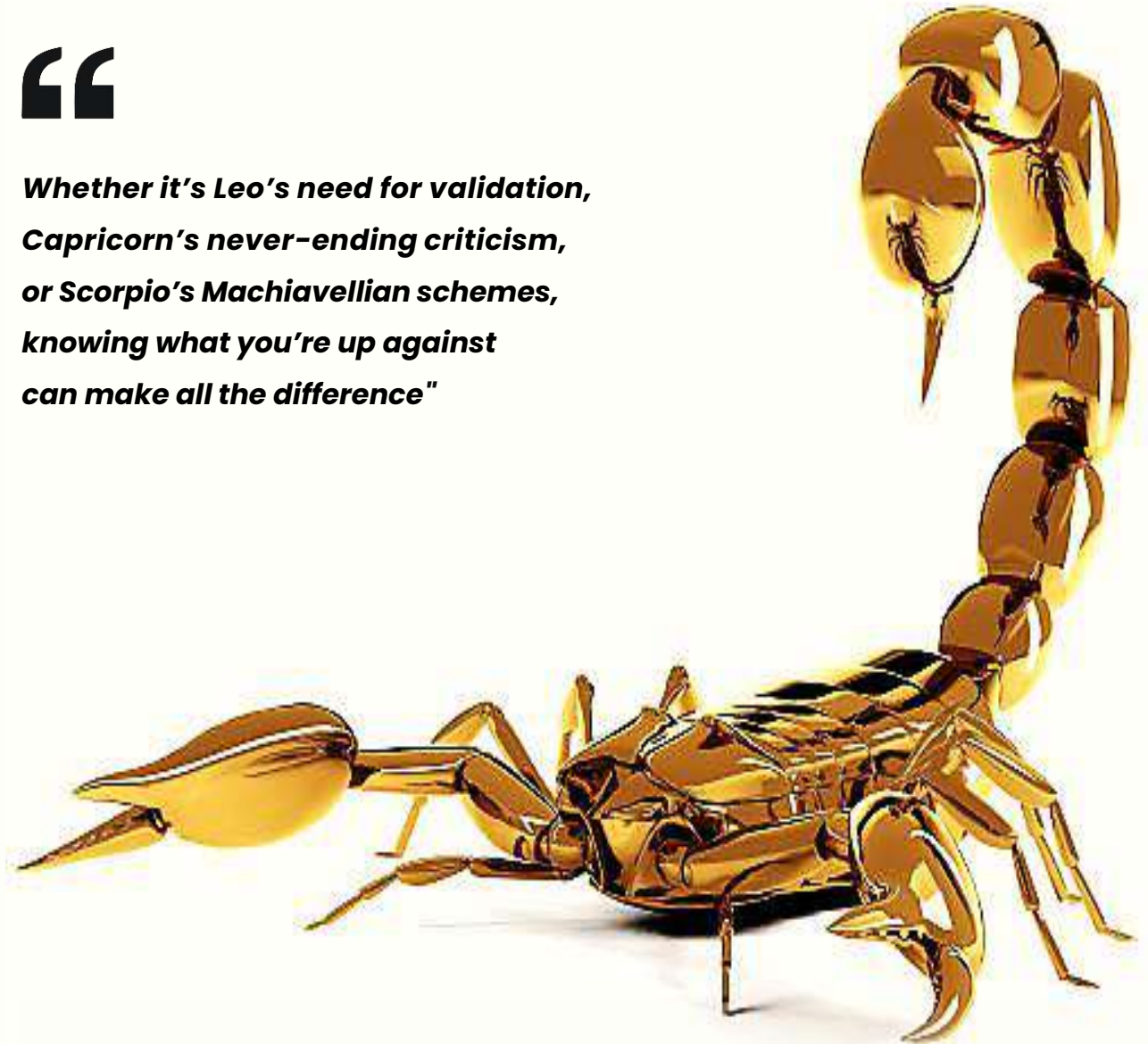
Capricorns are known for their incredible work ethic, but here's the issue—they think no-one else can do the job right.
